Dress Code

We rely on our partnership with families to uphold our standards and guidelines in assisting Pathfinders with making wise decisions about their appearance (clothing & grooming) at pathfinder meetings and events.

When making clothing or grooming choices, Pathfinders should:

- Ask: Does this attire glorify God, neither giving offense to anyone nor merely seeking my own profit? Am I respecting myself and my peers?
- Ensure clothing is in good repair, and while it may be of any color or pattern, it may not have writing, pictures, or unusually large logos.
- Ensure clothing is well-fitting (not too loose or tight), wrinkle-free, and opaque.

Note: Specifically, leggings, yoga pants and sweatpants are not appropriate for club activities.


- Ensure shirts are tucked in completely or fall below the pants-line at all times, including during any type of movement. Undergarments should not be visible.
- For water activities, please be mindful of the type of activity you will be doing and choose swimwear that will stay in place.

Note: Bikinis, thongs, and speedos are not appropriate.

- Pathfinders will adhere to the current uniform policy published by the North American division.
- Pathfinders will wear a Pathfinder shirt of their choice when the field uniform is prescribed for club meetings/events.

The Director/Deputy Director will serve as the final authority in interpreting and enforcing this dress code.

- Pathfinders are encouraged, whenever in doubt, to ask a club leader for clarification prior to wearing an outfit or article of clothing.
- If Pathfinders arrive dressed inappropriately, they will be asked to change or correct the clothing situation.
- If they are unable to comply, he/she will be asked to call a parent to bring clothing to the church.
