## Blended Families Louisiana Regional Weekend Strengthens Homes Through Christ

On May 15–16, 2026, families from across the region gathered in Baton Rouge for the Blended Families Louisiana Regional Weekend, a spirit-filled event focused on strengthening families through biblical principles, communication, and God’s design for the home.

Because the topic of blended families is so broad and deeply relevant in today’s society, the weekend was designed to provide greater understanding, practical guidance, and spiritual encouragement on how God can remain at the center of every family dynamic. The event created a safe and uplifting space where individuals and families could learn, reflect, heal, and grow together.

Guest speaker Dr. Patricia Hudson-Henry opened the weekend by defining the meaning of the word “blended.” She emphasized that, in many ways, all families are blended because each individual brings different backgrounds, personalities, life experiences, and expectations into the family structure. Through Scripture and practical examples, she explored God’s original design for families and reminded attendees that unity in the



home begins with Christ.

During the Sabbath morning message, Dr. Hudson-Henry spoke directly to both women and men, placing special emphasis on the God-given responsibilities of men as spiritual leaders and priests of the household. Drawing from biblical principles, she encouraged men to recommit themselves to God and to their families. Members were visibly moved as the service concluded with a heartfelt rededication, where men were invited to stand in recommitment to leading their homes with prayer, love, humility, and faithfulness.

Throughout the weekend, participants were reminded of the power of calm words over quick reactions and the importance of worship, prayer, and intentional communication in restoring families to what God intended them to be. After a fellowship meal, attendees returned for an engaging workshop that covered relationships, communication with biological and non-biological family members, sibling dynamics, navigating extended family relationships, and learning to love others according to their individual “love language.”

The discussions were honest, practical, and encouraging, equipping attendees with tools they could immediately apply within their homes and communities. A spirit of unity, healing, and hope filled the atmosphere as families shared experiences and learned from one another.

A wonderful time was had by all, with many leaving encouraged and inspired to strengthen their families through Christ-centered living. The weekend served as a powerful reminder that no family is perfect, but with God at the center, every family can grow stronger in love, grace, and unity.

## Turning Pain into Power: A Weekend of Healing, Hope, and Courage

On April 3–4, 2026, the Hot Springs Seventh-day Adventist Church in Hot Springs, Arkansas, became a sacred refuge of restoration, renewal, and strength. Women and men from across the region gathered for the *Turning Pain into Power Domestic Abuse Awareness Weekend*, hosted by the Women’s Ministries Department of the Arkansas-Louisiana Conference. This powerful gathering of the Arkansas regional meeting marked the second of two transformative weekends held across the ARKLAC territory this year, following the Louisiana session in January. Leaders and members from throughout the state came with open hearts, eager to be equipped, informed, and empowered on this critical issue. From the very first moments, the presence of God was unmistakable. Friday evening opened with heartfelt, spirit-filled music from the young people of the Hot Springs church, setting a tone of reverence and expectancy. The message that followed, delivered by Dr. Shannon Trecartin, Chair of Social Work at Andrews University and a trained *End It Now* presenter from the North American Division was both powerful and deeply personal. In her message, *“The God Who Sees: From Survival to Strength,”* she drew from the story of Sarai and Hagar to remind attendees of a profound truth: God sees, God cares, and God calls His people to stand courageously against abuse in all its forms.

Sabbath morning continued in a spirit of warmth, worship, and connection. In her sermon, *“A Church That Sees: From Pain to Healing,”* Dr. Trecartin invited the congregation into a deeper understanding of what it means to truly “see” one another—to recognize pain, extend compassion, and walk alongside those in need of healing. Anchored in Galatians 6:2, *“Carry each other’s burdens, and in this way you will fulfill the law of Christ,”* her message was rich with biblical clarity, authenticity, and hope. It resonated deeply, offering both comfort and conviction, especially to those who have endured pain in silence. The worship experience culminated in a moving rendition of *“Leaning on the Everlasting Arms,”* reminding all present of the peace and security found in Christ:

*What have I to dread, what have I to fear,  
Leaning on the everlasting arms?  
I have blessed peace with my Lord so near,  
Leaning on the everlasting arms.”*

Following a time of joyful fellowship over lunch, the afternoon transitioned into the first segment of the *End It Now* training. It was especially inspiring to see both men and women fully engaged learning together, asking thoughtful questions, and bravely confronting the realities of domestic abuse. Honest conversations unfolded, hearts opened, and a unified commitment emerged: to recognize the signs, break the silence, and become advocates for safety, dignity, and healing.

Participants traveled across Arkansas from Jonesboro to Fort Smith, Benton to Russellville, and Little Rock and beyond each leaving not only with knowledge, but with meaningful tools and reminders of hope. Attendees received safeguarding peace booklets, educational resources, journals, pens, and encouragement cards for life’s more difficult days. A particularly touching gift was a special glass keepsake, symbolizing that no matter what one has endured, they are deeply loved by God and are warriors marked by strength and resilience. This simple yet powerful token will stand as a daily reminder: they are seen, valued, and never alone.

The Arkansas-Louisiana Conference Women’s Ministries team extends heartfelt gratitude to the Hot Springs Church, its board of elders, and the entire church family for graciously opening their doors and hearts for this life-changing weekend. Their hospitality created a safe and sacred space where healing could begin and hope could flourish. This was more than a weekend event it was a movement of faith in action. Through education, compassion, testimony, and the unwavering love of Christ, lives were touched, hearts were strengthened, and pain was truly transformed into power.

Here is a quick look at how these changes will affect your submissions:

**Weekly deadlines:** Our goal is to share your news on our website and social media before the news is a week old. To accomplish this, we ask that you submit any stories about special events that happened over the weekend by the following Monday. See the bottom of this email for information on how to submit your stories.

**Photo stories:** Have something noteworthy to share but don't feel like you have the time or talent to sit down and write a story? No problem! It's been said that a photo is worth a thousand words, so we're adding photo stories to our news pages. Send us a strong photo that captures the essence of your event and one to three sentences to describe what happened. We'll share your photo stories on our website and social media and possibly within the pages of the print magazine. Don't forget, the bottom of this email will tell you how to submit.

**Photo captions:** We want to know who's in the picture! The *Record* is going to begin including captions with our photos (for both online and print stories). When you send us a photo, please help us out by including the following: 1. The full names of anyone in photos of three or fewer people, 2. A description of the group in any photo containing more than three people (Church members? Pathfinders? Conference attendees? Choir?) 3. Any other information that might help the caption writer describe what's going on (for example, if the photo is for a three-day event and was taken at Friday vespers, let us know the photo is from the vespers program).

You may continue submitting stories as you have been. If it's been a while since you submitted a story, we especially want to hear from you! Here are three ways to send in your stories:

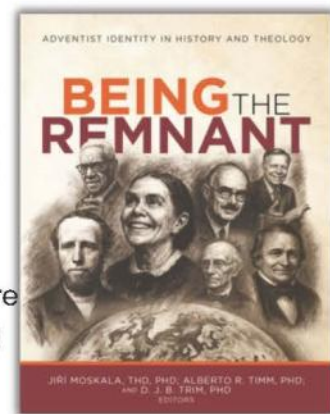

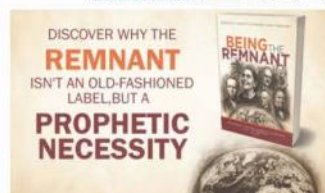
