Pastor’s Corner:

There is something fascinating about watching a seed disappear into the ground.

- For a while, absolutely nothing seems to have happened.
- No movement. No growth. No evidence that anything is taking place beneath the surface.
- If we’re honest, much of life with God can feel like that.
- We pray for a loved one and see no immediate change. We try to develop healthier habits and stumble more than we succeed. We attempt to be faithful in small things and wonder whether any of them really matters.
- We live in a world that celebrates visible results. We like dashboards, progress bars, and before-and-after photos. We want proof that our efforts are working. Yet God often does some of His best work underground, where no one can see it.
- Jesus once compared the kingdom of God to seed growing in a field. The farmer plants it, goes about his daily life, and somehow the seed begins to grow (Mark 4:26-28). The remarkable part is that much of the process remains hidden.
- Perhaps that is encouraging news for us.
- Not every act of faithfulness produces immediate results. Not every prayer is answered on our timetable. Not every season of growth comes with visible evidence.
- Sometimes God is doing His deepest work in places we cannot yet see.
- Like roots spreading beneath the soil before a tree reaches toward the sky, God is often preparing something long before it becomes visible.
- As you move through the coming week, take a moment to consider where God may be quietly at work beneath the surface of your life.

3. Place your offering on the offering plate when it is passed.

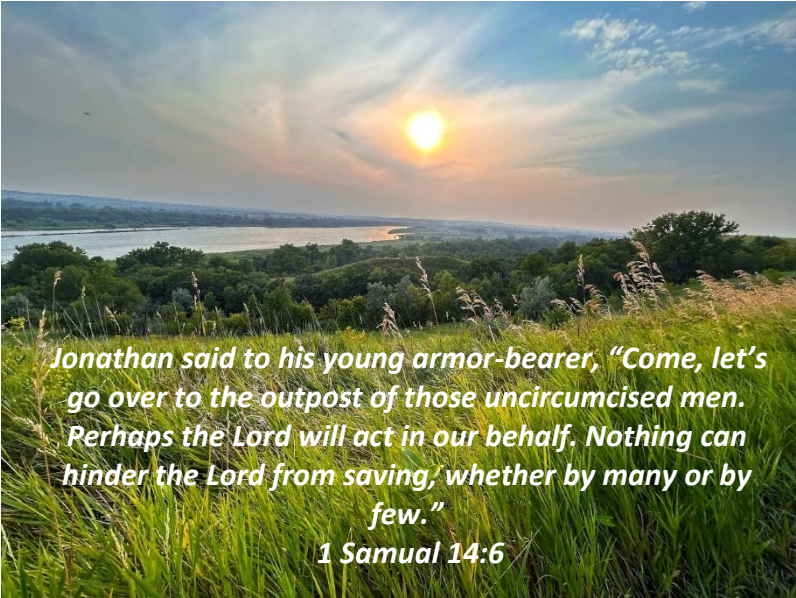
