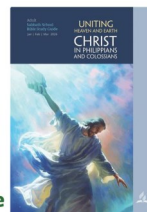

BMT SUMMER PROGRAMS FOR KIDS

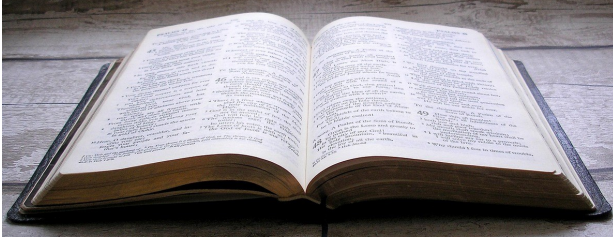
