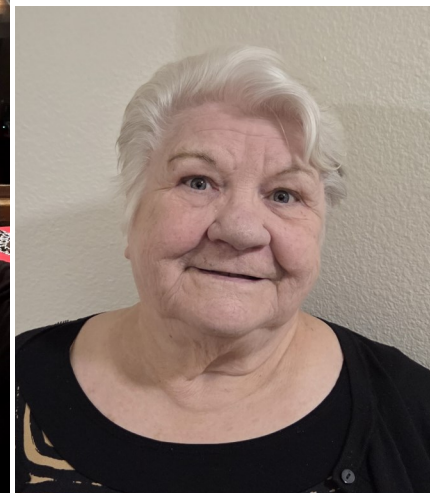


American Red Cross

Thanks to those that came out to give blood in February and to those who volunteered to help.

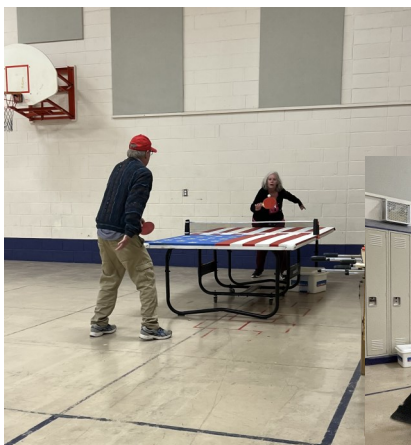
Thursday's drive went great with 30 donors, 37 units collected, 6 first time donor and 17 Type O donors. What a wonderful day!!
