A Work That Continues to Grow—Even to Salvation



The school continues to serve more than 50 children from over 30 families in the surrounding community. On April 27, the children began the second term of their three-term school year. Each day, these children are cared for, taught, and introduced to Jesus in a consistent and meaningful way. **You can see the light of Jesus in**

their eyes through the happy smiles and contented looks on their faces.

What is really beautiful is that the faithful cook, **who helps provide more than 100 meals a day for these children**, has seen the hands and feet of Jesus at work through the Children of the King School. Coupled with the life-giving Word of God on her Adventist World Radio Godpod—a solar-powered device loaded with the Bible and Christ-centered messages of salvation—she has found her Savior and is delighted to be part of this growing and visionary mission!

Through the Godpods, hearts are continuing to be awakened—not only hers, but also among the children, their families, and the surrounding community.

Planning the Next Steps

As we look ahead, one need now stands clearly before us. Water. With approximately \$13,000 already provided, we are moving closer to what is needed to drill a well for the school and the surrounding community.

In this region, water is not easily accessible. A well will not only support the school—it **will serve an incredible need for families throughout the area** and strengthen what is already

taking root. In a simple and practical way, **this reflects Jesus' method**: to come close to people, desire their good, show sympathy, minister to their needs, and win their confidence—so they may see Jesus more clearly and be drawn to follow Him.

For years, Saruni and Matthew have poured themselves into the lives of these children—serving, teaching, and caring with sacrificial hearts. God sees this work. Their investment is not only meeting present needs; it is shaping lives for eternity and building a foundation that will impact generations to come.

What a beautiful reminder that this quiet work among little ones is truly kingdom work!



Because of that faithful investment, the children are growing too. They range in age from 2 to 10, with an average age of just 4½ years old—and they take their learning very seriously!

Recently, they completed their nationwide competency exams and have been doing well, a meaningful milestone for a young and growing school.

We saw another needed blessing this month. Several of the children received free medical care and medication through the Kisima Health Center. For a growing bush school serving more than 50 children with limited resources, this was a gift we do not take for granted.
