In Phonics, we reviewed long vowel sounds using the silent e, the two sounds of c and g, the -dge spelling pattern, and spelling larger, two-syllable words. It was a big week for Phonics!

In Reading, we stretched our comprehension by making connections to what we read, identifying the author's purpose, and finding the meaning of unknown words. We also practiced using our voices to make our reading more interesting to listen to.

In Math, we practiced all the strategies we have been learning for addition and subtraction within 20 as we prepare for our first end-of-unit test.

In Bible, we studied Psalm 121 with a focus on the loving protection God provides us. We also began memorizing scripture, beginning with Isaiah 41:10. Check in with your child to see how they are coming on this treasure verse.

- In **Reading**, we wrapped up our first unit on *George Washington Carver*.
- In **Bible**, we began reading the story of *King Saul*.
- In **Science**, we experimented with how water moves through plants using the xylem system. Be sure to ask your child about plant and animal cells, as well as the different plant systems, tissues, and organs we've been studying.

Please continue to encourage your child to review spelling words and memory verses each week.
