A GROUNDBREAKING *Testimony*

It started with a flood. It revealed that water had been seeping down between the front entrance concrete steps and platform and entering the building through eroded mortar for an unknown length of time. That meant our front entrance had to be torn up to patch up the exterior brick wall. That meant the basement had to be gutted, foundation repaired, and new drywall installed in many areas due to rot from water damage. Painting the walls made everything clean and fresh. But then with mold on everyone's mind and dust making things prohibitive for some to worship, the old carpet in the foyer and sanctuary was removed. Somewhere along the way, people noticed major ceiling tile stains growing. How could a congregation of about 30 people afford to do all this renovation? Who has those skills to help guide the church through all these repairs and renovations?

For one thing we serve a mighty God who has no trouble with logistics. A parishioner, Fred Caston, had left some money for the church in his will. Pastor Ryan Fraser and head elder, Garry Baltzer, who have skills and work experience in building, spent a lot of time working on these projects with other volunteers. And the money which was tied up with attorneys executing the will came into the hands of the church just in time for the roof to be repaired before a major storm would have caused serious troubles. At the March 8th work bee, seven men removed the panels off the walls, took down window fixtures, removed baseboard covers as they prepared the sanctuary, balcony, and deacon rooms to be drywalled. The

six ladies cleared out items in areas that needed to be accessible for renovations and sorted through them. They made sure everything that was kept was organized in such a way to leave the basement still accessible for work or for worship.

The March 8th work bee not only worked towards meeting safety regulations but giving the church a fresh look. The expectation is that over the next six months, the church will undergo a transformation with fresh drywall and paint, new windows, new floors in the sanctuary, heat pumps, a wheelchair ramp, steps and deck for the front entrance. When we



consider all that we want to do, it seems impossible given our constraints of time and energy. Our few members either are elderly or work full time, and those with experience will be laid up after surgery. But having seen how God has led in the last year inspires us to know God is making it possible for the church to weather another 50 years if need be as we wait for the Lord to return.

Chickpea Blondies

Ingredients:

- 1 can (15 oz) chickpeas (rinsed)
- ½ cup natural peanut butter (can try cashew butter, almond butter)
- 1/3 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- ½ tsp baking powder (preferably homemade)
- ¼ tsp salt
- ½ cup carob chips (sweetened or unsweetened your choice)

Instructions:

1. Preheat oven to 350°F (175°C) and line an 8x8-inch pan with parchment paper.
2. Place all ingredients, except the carob chips in a food processor and process until completely smooth.
3. Pour into the lined pan, then either fold in the carob chips before spreading the mixture out or spread the mixture first and sprinkle the chips on top.
4. Bake for 30-35 minutes until lightly browned and your toothpick comes out clean.

Let cool and then cut into squares. Enjoy!

WALK FOR ADRA

Would you follow in Christ's footsteps?

Every day, ADRA walks alongside people in need of God's love.

We walk with farmers through drought-stricken fields.

We walk with children through earthquake-rocked neighbourhoods.

We walk with families through impossible financial struggles.

But most importantly, we walk with them from hardship to hope.

And now, we're inviting you to walk with them too.

Sophie, a young girl in Kenya, used to walk miles beyond her village to fetch water from the river. For her and so many young girls like her across Africa and Asian, walking 6km per day to collect water is not uncommon. The physical strain often leads to injury, but they rarely have a choice.

ADRA supporters and partners helped to ensure Sophie could safely pump water within her own village rather than carry a heavy jar the equivalent of 15 laps around a track.

For families fleeing economic catastrophe and gang violence in Venezuela, a **4,000-to-6,000 kilometre journey** often involves walking **15 to 30 km in a single day**. They carry their children and the few belongings they can, in search of safety and a future.

People like them are the reason why we're inviting you to take part in the **#WalkForADRA challenge** this March.



Choose a distance. Walk each day (or as often as you can commit)—minus a well-needed day of rest! Ask your friends and family to sponsor your journey and help us raise \$50,000. You will also find a poster attached that you can share in your church for awareness.

Because when you walk...

- **5 km** → you walk alongside a child on their way to school
- **6 km** → you walk the daily distance many girls walk for water
- **10 km** → you accompany a farmer from their home to the market
- **15 km** → you experience a day in the life of a migrant family
- **50 km in a month** → you symbolically share in part of a journey towards hope

Every step you take helps fund ADRA's **Where Needed Most Fund**, allowing us to respond quickly when disaster strikes and support families rebuilding their lives. But more than that—we want to walk with Christ, and to serve him through “the least of these” (Matthew 25:40) as he taught us.

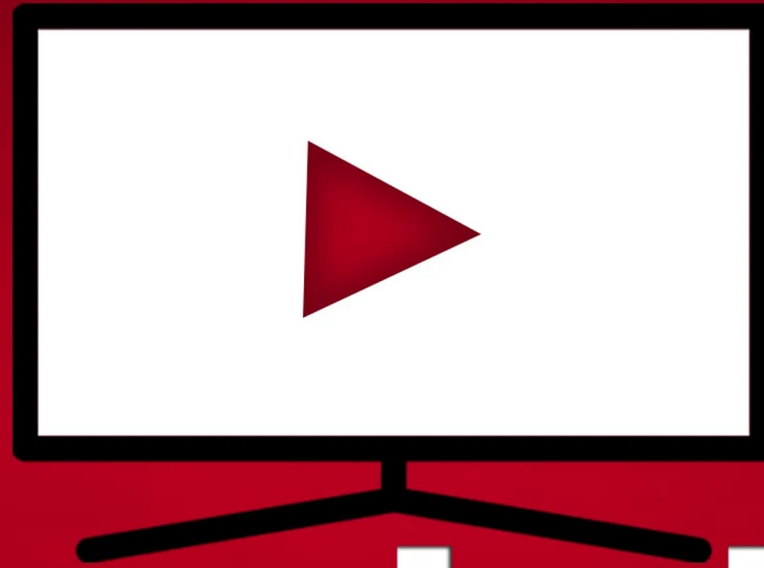
