The Secret of Solomon's Wisdom

Starting today, I'd like to share stories of Bible heroes whose lives can inspire us to live with faith, courage, and integrity. Let's begin with someone often called the wisest person in human history. Does a name come to mind? Yes—King Solomon.

When people hear Solomon's name, many remember the famous story of the two women who both claimed to be the mother of one baby. There was no DNA test in those days, yet Solomon solved the impossible. He declared, "Cut the child in two and give each woman half." The real mother immediately cried out, "Please, don't hurt the baby—give him to her!" Through this test, Solomon revealed the true mother's heart. That judgment made him known throughout the world as a man of divine wisdom.

The Bible describes his wisdom in these words: "And God gave Solomon wisdom and exceedingly great understanding, and largeness of heart like the sand on the seashore. Thus Solomon's wisdom excelled the wisdom of all the men of the East and all the wisdom of Egypt. For he was wiser than all men... and his fame was in all the surrounding nations." (1 Kings 4:29–31, NKJV) Even the Queen of Sheba traveled far to see if Solomon's wisdom was real. After meeting him, she confessed that what she had heard didn't even tell half the story—he was truly greater and wiser than any rumor had claimed.

But how did Solomon become such a wise man? Who was his teacher? What kind of education did he receive that made him the wisest person ever to live? The Bible gives a surprising answer: his wisdom came from God. When Solomon became king, God appeared to him and asked, "What shall I give you?" That was a blank check. He could have asked for wealth, power, fame, long life, or victory over his enemies. But Solomon asked for none of these. Instead, he prayed: "Give Your servant an understanding heart to judge Your people, that I may discern between good and evil." (1 Kings 3:9, NKJV) Solomon's secret was simple: he asked God for wisdom—not for himself, but to serve others. That is the kind of prayer God loves to answer. James 1:5 reminds us: "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God, who gives to all liberally and without reproach, and it will be given to him."

True wisdom doesn't come from books, grades, or technology alone. It begins with reverence for God and a desire to do what is right. When we pray for wisdom—not for our own success, but to bless others—God promises to give it generously. Just as Solomon prayed for wisdom to lead his people, let us also pray for heavenly wisdom to guide our studies, our friendships, and our choices each day. And remember: the purpose of wisdom is never to make ourselves great, but to make the world around us better.

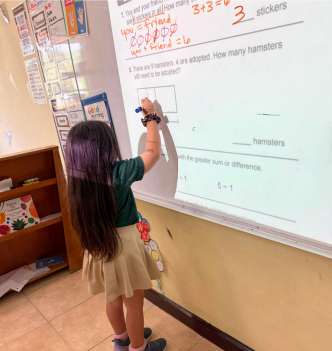
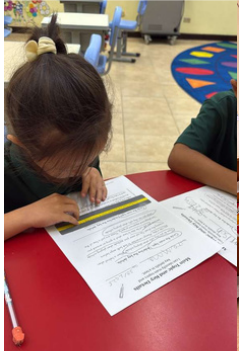

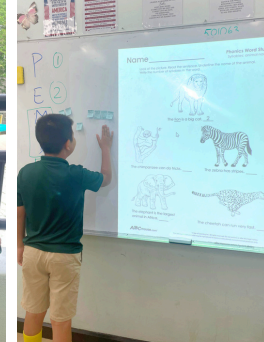
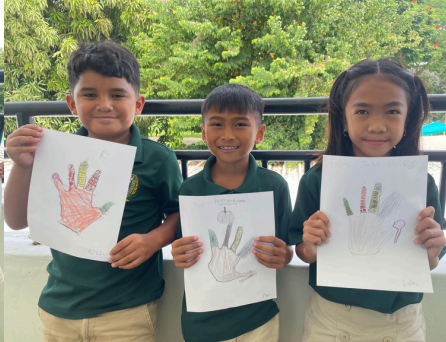
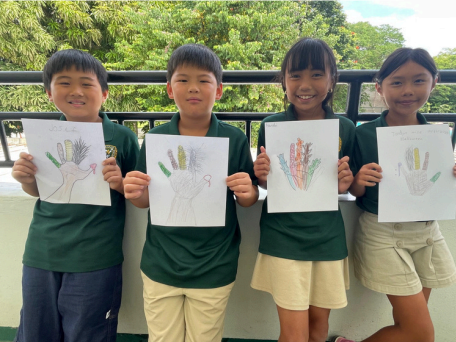
Kindergarten - Left to right: Making paper spinning wheels as we finished the story of creation and collecting objects from nature to make a piece of art.



1st Grade - Left to right: Reviewing Math test, strengthening their Math skills, and enjoying reading time.



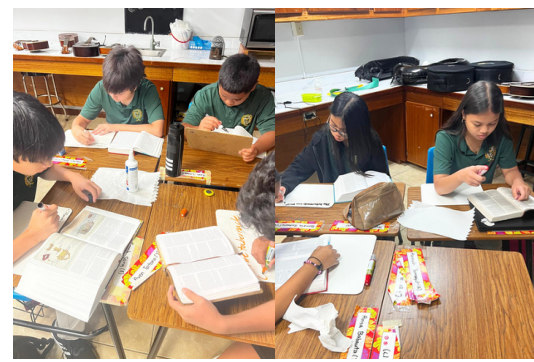
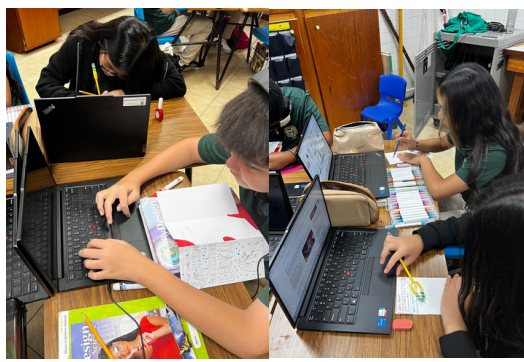
2nd Grade - Left to right: Spending time on Let's Go Learn and learning how to master alphabetization to enhance organizational skills.

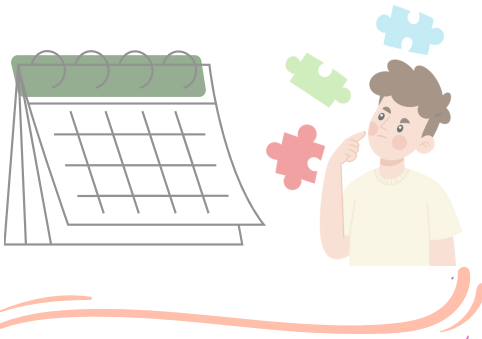

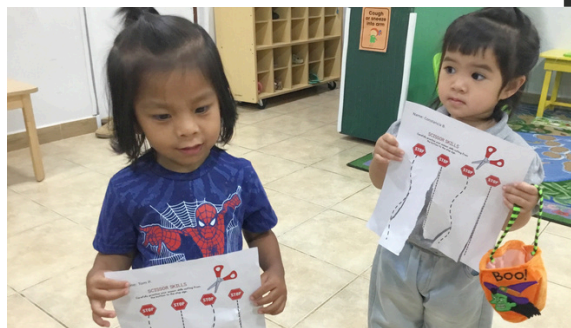
