The Event That Divided History

Human history often marks turning points by events that changed the course of civilization. We divide eras by moments that reshape how people live. For example, the Industrial Revolution, which began in England, marks the transition from the medieval world to the modern age. The steam engine powered that transformation. It reshaped industry, transportation, and the structure of society itself.

In our own time, many people speak of the world before and after the smartphone. The arrival of the iPhone and the rise of smartphones launched a new digital era. These devices changed how we communicate, work, learn, and even think. Others speak of the world before and after COVID-19. The pandemic disrupted economies, reshaped daily life, and triggered inflation and rising costs many societies still face today. And now, another turning point is appearing before our eyes: the age before and after artificial intelligence. The emergence of tools such as ChatGPT and other AI systems has begun to transform how people write, study, work, and solve problems. Just as the internet changed the world a generation ago, AI may reshape education, business, and human creativity in ways we are only beginning to understand. Yet there is a division far greater than any of these.

Human history itself is split into B.C. and A.D. — Before Christ and Anno Domini, Latin for "in the year of our Lord." Whether people believe in the Christian God or not, the world still measures all of history by the birth of one man: Jesus Christ. (Later scholarship suggests He was likely born around 4 B.C., which only deepens the irony.) If we speak of Jesus, a question naturally follows: what was the most meaningful event in His life? Most would answer immediately: His death. Through it, the penalty of sin fell upon Him, and those who believe receive forgiveness and eternal life. But a second question must be asked — what if He had died and never risen again? The Bible is direct: "And declared to be the Son of God with power... by the resurrection from the dead." (Romans 1:4)

During His earthly ministry, many already believed Jesus was the Son of God — they witnessed His miracles, His authority, and recognized Him as the long-awaited Messiah. But had He remained in the grave, He would have been remembered only as a remarkable teacher. Instead, He conquered death. By rising, Jesus proved who He truly is.

As Easter approaches, let us remember more than a tradition. Let us reflect on the risen Christ — the One who defeated death and promises life beyond the grave — and renew our faith in Him as our personal Savior.

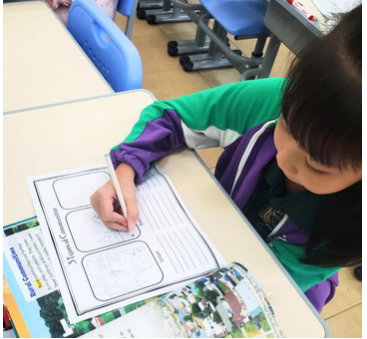




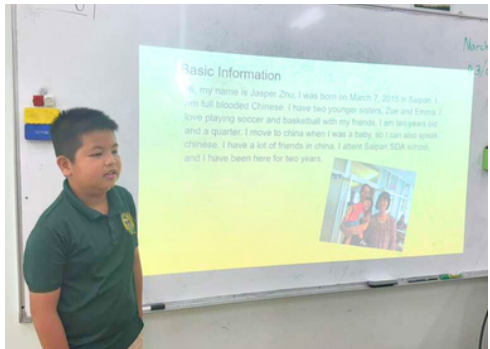
Kindergarten - Left to right: Connecting the bones to make a skeleton, stretching to demonstrate that our body is made to move, and matching theme words to pictures.



1st Grade - Left to right: Learning about cities in Social Studies; practicing for chapel; and labeling and colouring North America in Social Studies.



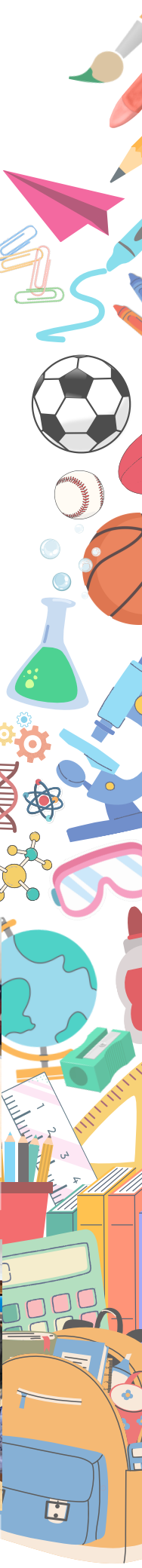

5th & 6th Grade - Left to right: Learning about Greek art and architecture and working on their summative reading assessment.



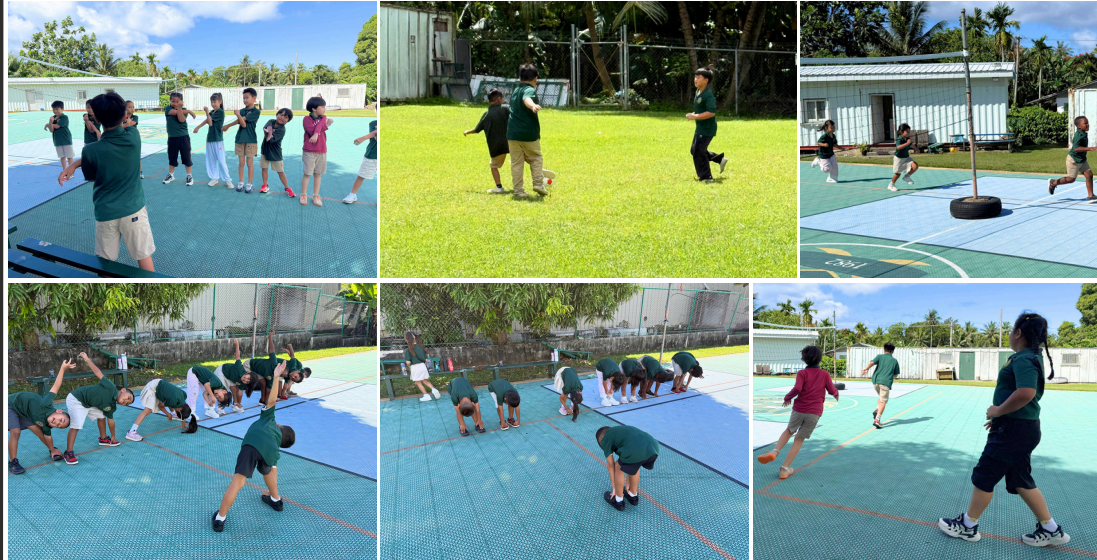
