2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

“Discipling” has been the theme last four years for Asian Pacific Region pastors and congregations. Though we are divided by 9 different ethnic, language and cultural groups, we all share the common understanding and support the importance of the discipleship principle and practice for evangelism and church growth.

2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

To implement the emphasis of “Discipling,” Asian Pacific Region promoted every year a ‘**small group festival**,’ an opportunity for all our pastors to learn, to be inspired and motivated, not only by seminary professors, by high-achieving pastors in this area, but also by our own pastors and congregations sharing their own efforts, failures and successes. Now we know that more than 80% of the Asian Pacific Region churches practice some sort of small group discipleship training meetings during weekdays and weekends.

2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

Every other year—two times during the quadrennium—the Asian Pacific Region sponsored an ‘Empower Ministry’ youth leadership training convention for potential local church youth leaders. This was a joint venture together with Southeastern California Conference Asian Pacific churches. Over 400 youths registered each time to learn and be trained by lectures and examples in small group settings as well as by fellowship.



2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

We are sure nobody would disagree that ministers' spouses have an important role. The Asian Pacific Region has organized and operated Shepherdess meetings 2-3 times a year to help the pastors and church ministry. Topics were practical ones, such as stress management, healthy help-mate roles, finance management, parenting pastors' kids seminars and couple dynamics in the parsonage home as well as social fellowship supporting one another, etc.

We started Lay Leadership Training School among Korean churches in the southern California area. Last year and this year, each time over 100 male and female leaders from local churches attended and have been educated and trained to serve congregations and communities to which they belong.

2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

Since the Asian Pacific Region has a variety of cultural and language groups, we always support and promote the concept of unity in diversity. A Multicultural Music Festival was designed to meet this need. We celebrated this concert with 10 different kinds of ethnic and cultural choirs, among 700 eagerly participating, colorful attendees from many nations and tongues.



During the last four years, the Asian Pacific Region experienced a 4.9% growth of membership from 6,249, in 2010 to 6,556 in 2014. which means 307 net growth including 510 baptisms and 269 profession by faith, or an average 1.25% yearly growth. Tithe increased by 7%, from \$5,360,120.80 in 2010 to \$5,739,333.56 in 2014. This increase totaled \$379,212.76, an average 1.8% annual growth.

2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (2011 -2014)

Asian Pacific Region churches are very strong with VBS program every year. 80% of churches are participating this important children's ministry and subsidized by the region. Children are not just future of our churches but we believe they are 'present' of churches.

Company: Yorba Linda group organized into Yorba Linda company transferred to SECC

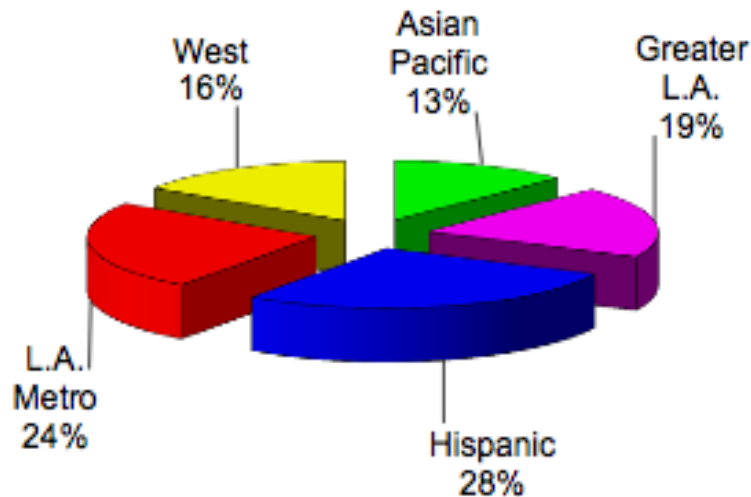
2015 Asian Pacific Region Report (201 -2014)

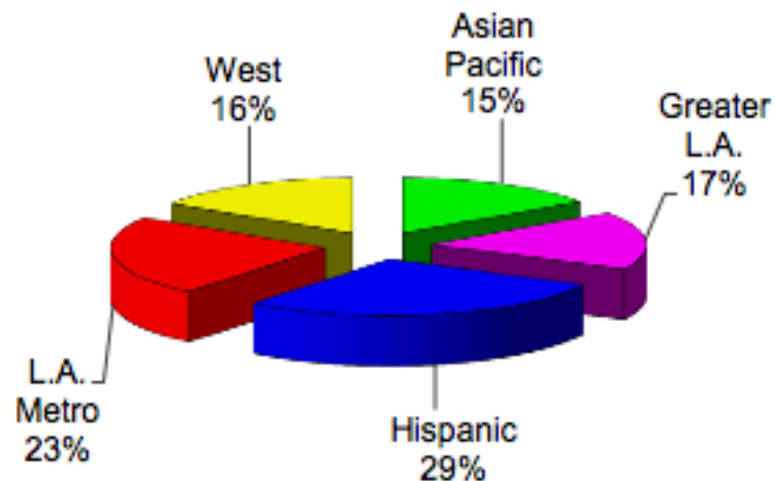

2005



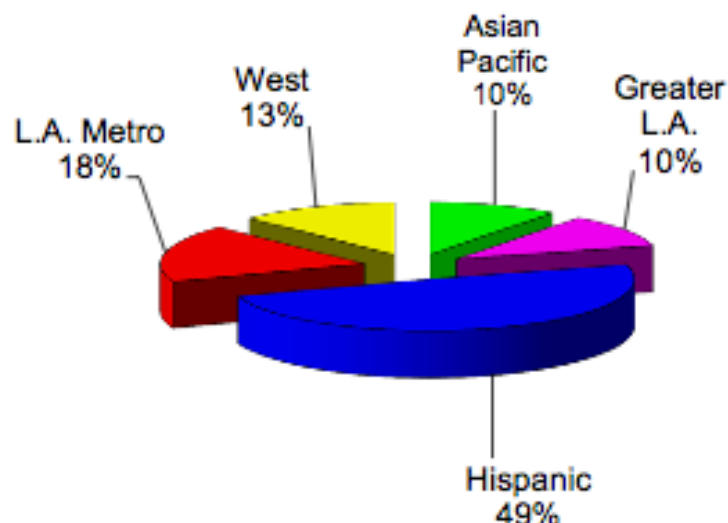

2014



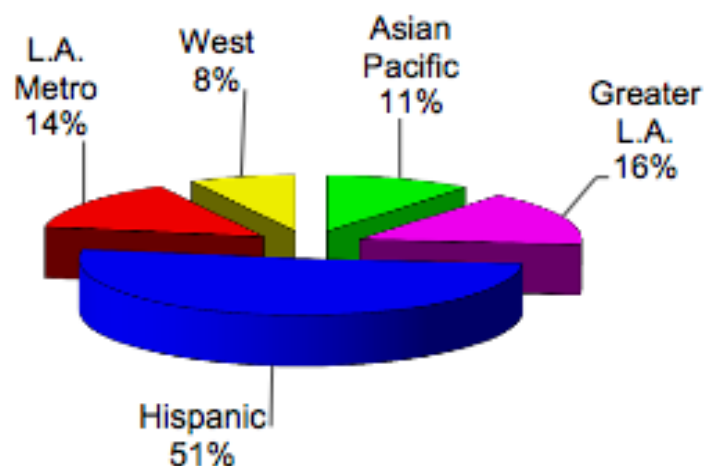

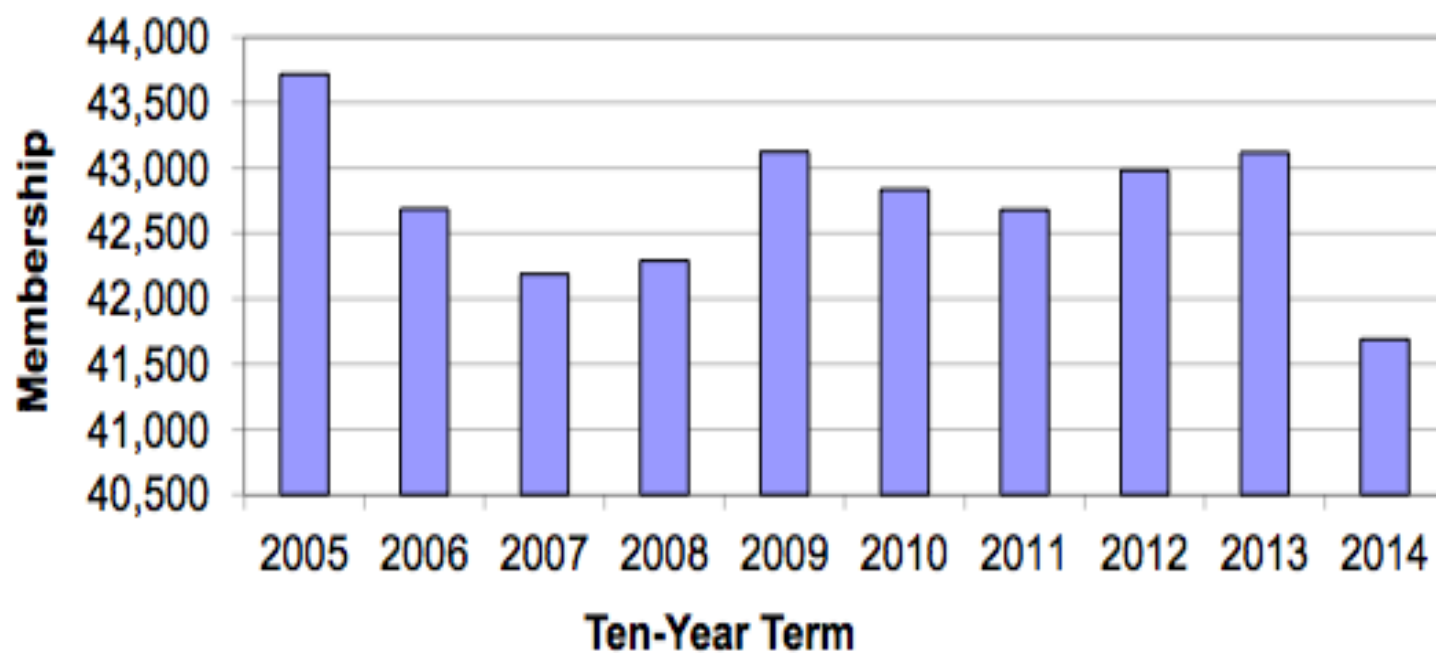
